A Second Set of Hands!

The members of First Lutheran recently voted to extend a call to Pastor Floyd Smithey to help out on a part-time basis here at our congregation. He will be serving us up to 20 hours per week, enabling us to move beyond the usual ministry items that have taken place in the past.

Having a second set of hands is really nothing new to First Lutheran. A few years ago Pastor Derek Roberts was called to help expand the ministry here and to help with the ministerial duties. Pastor Smithey's presence will help us do the same.

With the unique challenges of our congregation, it will be nice to have more Bible class opportunities being offered. Pastor Smithey is already planning on helping out here with the possibility of a study on the book of Revelation to start us out.

It will also be nice to have another pastor to help with our worship services. To do Wednesday services, for example, on a year-round basis is a challenge for a single pastor to do because they require, for example, a second sermon to be written and learned every week. Single pastor parishes with more than one service will often have a service on Saturday evening utilizing the same message as the one on Sunday morning, helping him conserve time and energy. Second services are usually intended, as well, to be for those who can't make it on Sunday. We envision a second set of hands to be helpful both for Wednesday services as well as some Sunday services.

With Pastor Smithey helping out we will be able to increase our visitations to members – something that has gotten more challenging in a day and age of increased activity and unavailability. This is something that will help increase contacts with members resulting, hopefully, in better church attendance as well as stewardship of our offerings. As time unfolds, there may be other items that Pastor Smithey will help us accomplish.

One might ask the question, "why a second set of hands?" Well, why not? If you have one pastor doing the same things the previous pastor always did, nothing will really change. First Lutheran needs some change. It needs to offer some different things, and perhaps some new things. A second set of hands will hopefully take us in that direction.

Having said that, we are happy to welcome Pastor Smithey aboard! He will be a good asset to have. We thank him, as well, for his servanthood and for offering his talents again to the church. At present we are awaiting formal approval by the District President. As we receive that, we'll begin. Please keep Pastor Smithey in your prayers! We thank God for him!

STEWARDSHIP – "I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:8-9).

Without commands or even arm-twisting, St. Paul encourages, even challenges, the Church in Corinth to demonstrate the sincerity of their faith by their generosity in giving. He does this because giving generously is a gift of the Spirit given to us through the Gospel.

St. Paul wrote: "But just as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us—see that you also excel in this grace of giving" (2 Corinthians 8:7). In other words, just as we grow in faith and speech and knowledge of eternal things by the Holy Spirit through the Word of God, so also do we grow in giving from the same Spirit through the same Word.

The problem is that the grace of generosity often grows cold in us. It's not so much that we stop giving, but we don't put it first. We treat it like all the other bills that must be paid. It becomes a chore, just one more thing to check off a list of things to do. That empties it of its spiritual power and robs us of the joy that Christ and the Scriptures assign to it.

On top of that, since this generosity is linked to faith and knowledge of divine things, a lack of excelling in giving is a sure sign that our faith and knowledge of God are under attack as well.

Thus St. Paul points to the foundation of generosity: the generosity of Christ Himself. Even though He was rich, He became poor so that we who are poor might become rich. Thus, the incarnation, suffering, and death of our Lord on the cross is the reason, source, and driving force for our generosity in giving to the church.

And since Christ who was rich became poor so that we might be rich in His grace—of which generous giving is part—so we also who are rich in His grace can excel in pressing His grace into service toward the gracious work of the church.

Pay attention to what you give to the church so that you may excel at it. And if you find that your heart has grown cold or indifferent toward it, immerse yourself in God's Word. Read it at home. Attend Bible Class. Hear and listen to it preached in the Divine Service.

Be reminded of what Christ has done for you in His incarnation, suffering, and death. For this will strengthen your faith and knowledge. And where that excels, so will the grace of giving excel also.
