Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ at First Lutheran:

As many of you already know, our Pastor Edward Schmidt, has begun a period of medical leave. This leave follows a period of intense distress. Though we all have our ideas about what Pastor has been enduring, the truth is that none of us know what he is suffering. He has never gone through anything like this in his thirty some years of ministry or in his life. He has never before missed a worship service because of illness. All of his advisers, both medical and ministerial have advised him to take this medical leave. They have counseled him to "get off the battlefield" - a description of the ministry I have heard lately which is well thought out and experience-backed in its expression.

The first question which many ask when learning of this is: How long will this last? The only answer I can give is: We don't know.

We must take each day that the Lord gives us and use it wisely. We should all pray for our Pastor and for his wife, Mary, and for their family. We should empathize with their situation as much as we can - while realizing that we can not fully empathize. As one said recently, "We have got to pray our pastor through this!" And we can do that! That is what we are good at! We are people of prayer because we know that when we pray in the Name of the Son of God, Christ Jesus, God hears us and will answer our prayers. So, members of First Lutheran, offer prayers to God for our Pastor and for First Lutheran like never before. Pray ceasingly - pray during the day and pray during the night. God hears the prayers of a righteous man. And we are "righteous" because we have faith in the "righteousness" of our Lord Jesus. Pray. Pray. Pray. Even ask the Lord God to help you pray!

So, during these days when our Pastor is out on medical leave, I will fill in as best I can. One situation you should know about is this: After I served as your Vacancy Pastor and before I accepted your call as Associate Pastor, I accepted four dates to do pulpit supply in other congregations. These dates are May 20, June 3, July 8, and July 15. I will not accept any other pulpit supply dates until after Pastor Schmidt returns from medical leave.

A pulpit supply pastor for First Lutheran for this coming Sunday, May 20 has been found. He is Pastor Phil Bohiken. The elders will address the other dates for pulpit supply as time passes. We will continue to have Wednesday night services for the foreseeable future though the elders and Pastor continue to review having these services. We will continue to study the Psalms on Wednesday night, sing hymns, pray, and have communion with our Lord Jesus.

As an Associate Pastor at First Lutheran, I will surely not fill the shoes of our Pastor. But, I am available. If you need me, please feel free to call me, email me, text me or yell at me in the hallways to communicate with me. I am not a perfect servant of our Lord. You will, no doubt, need to have much patience to deal with me as I am an old man - probably on the edge of senility. I pray that the Lord will give you patience during this time when our Pastor is ill.

HELP US WITH PRAYER REQUESTS!

It's good that we submit prayer requests to the Church for Sunday mornings. As you submit a request, please help us out by keeping the following items in mind:

- 1. When submitting someone's name for public prayers on Sunday, please make sure you have the permission of that person to do so! Once in a while someone wants their situation to remain private. Please make sure it's okay to pray for them publically.
- 2. When submitting prayer requests, it's always helpful to call them or e-mail them in to the church office before Sunday if possible. this

helps us to place them into the bulletin and also enables the pastor to have them before service. Parishioners can also give them to the pastor before service. He will do his best to include it, but last minute requests can sometimes be forgotten.

3. ALSO! This is very important! Once in a while prayer request is turned in and for some reason it was missed in the Sunday morning prayers. If this happens, please don't panic. It was a simple oversight. A gentle reminder would be helpful since we deal with a great deal of information during the course of the week. We never intend to miss a prayer request but once in a while it can happen.

4. When submitting a prayer request, please also let us know if someone has gotten better and the prayer request can be removed. Generally, we will pray for someone on Sunday morning for about three to four weeks unless the circumstances they are in continue. Let us know if the request can be removed or if it needs to be continued.

STEWARDSHIP – "There are three conversions necessary to every man: the head, the heart, and the purse." Attributed to Luther, though yet to be located in his vast writings, this statement echoes what Jesus taught about hearts and treasures. He said, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matthew 6:21; Luke 12:34).

But which conversion comes first? We submit that the order is this: first the head, then the purse, then the heart.

Through the preaching of Law and Gospel, God grants us repentance, a changing of our minds. It is a conversion of the mind. We are called to turn away from our sins and turn toward Him for forgiveness, life, and salvation.

He calls us to a new life, with new deeds. This is the conversion of the purse. Jesus said that "it is easier for a camel to enter through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God" (Matthew 19:24). "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

Notice that our hearts follow our treasures, not the other way around. As Christians, God calls us to invest our treasures in His Kingdom to ensure that the gospel is preached and the sacraments are administered.

So where is your treasure? If it is not invested in the kingdom of God, then the only response is repentance—a conversion of the heart—and to begin doing just that. And as our Lord promised, where your treasure is there your heart will be also.

This is not to say that you earn your way into heaven. It is simply to say that as Christians, those who have been made to be temples of the Holy Spirit, who have been given a new life in Christ, who are dead to sin and now alive in Him, we are, actually, to live — think (conversion of the mind), do (conversion of the purse), and be (conversion of the heart) — a new life in Him.
