& \text { Article I -- Name }
\end{aligned}

The name of this Society shall be the Walther League of First Lutheran Church of Knoxville, Tennessee.
Article II -- Objects

In conformity with the objects of the International Walther League, the objects of this Society shall be:

1. To assist, through the Society and under the auspices of the respective congregation and the leadership of the Pastor, in keeping our young people within the church.
2. To pronote systematic study of the Bible and constant growth in Christian knowledge.
3. To assist in training every individual member for a life of Christian service.
4. To assist the Pastor in serving fellow Lutherans who are traveling and who are away from home.
5. To furthor love for, and to assist in increasing active participation in the mission work of our church, both at home and abroad.
6. To foster Christian love and fellowship, and to provide material for wholesome recreation.
7. To encourage the support of charitable endeavors within the Lutheran Church.
8. To promote loyalty to the Christian home.
9. To help organize and maintain societies.
10. To unite all young people's Societies within the Synodical Conference into one body and thus establish a closer outward union amone them.
Article III -- Membership
11. Any confirmed member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, as recommended by the committee on membership is eligible to active membership in this Society.
12. Honorary members shall be individuals who have not been confirmed in the Evangelical Lutheran Church, but who have been of particular benefit to the Society. They must be elected unanimously.
13. If the report of the Membership Committee regarding a proposed member is favorable, the latter becomes a member of the Society upon taking the Walther League Pledge and signing the Constitution of the Society.

\text { Article IV -- Duties and Privileges } \\

Mombers shall conduct themselves as Christians, be active in all affairs of the Society, pay dues regularly, and attend all meetings.

Article V -- Officers and Committees
The officers of this Society shall be a president, a vicepresident, a secretary, and a treasurer.

These officers, together with the Pastor and Chairman of the Department of Christian Growth, and Chairman of the Membership Committee, shall constitute the excutive board.

## Article VI -- Election of Officers

Election of officers shall take place in the first of May business meeting.

The president shall appoint a nominating committee of three (3) members in the first March business meeting.

The nominating committee shall present a list of candidates, two (2) for each office, in the first April business meeting. In this meeting additional names may be offered as candidates by any active member of the Society, after which the proposed list of candidates shall be closed.

The noninating commettee shall prepare a ballat for the first May business necting, each active member receiving a ballot. The members of the nominating comnittee shall serve as tellers and announce the result of the election.

Active members only, who have been members of the Society for at least six (6) months, shall be cligible for office and shall be elected for a term of one (1) year.

Officers elected in the May meeting shall be installed in, and begin their term of office with the first Junc business meeting.

Election to fill vacancies for the unexpired term may be held at any regular meeting of the Society.

Election of officers shall take place in this order: president, vice-president, sccetary, treasurer, and chairman of Christian growth.

\text { Article VII -- Duties of officers } \\

The president shall preside at all meotings, shall enforce all
rules and rogulations of the Society, and cooperate with all appointed secretaries and comittees in the furtherance of the Society's objects.

The secretary shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings at all meetings, shall send out all necessary notices. Keep an accurate record of all members of the Society, receive and answer all correspondence, shall furnish the officers of the International and the District League all desirod information, shall promptly convey to the Society all communcations of the League's officers, shall have charce of the subscription lists of and be the correspondent for the Walther League Messenger and the Concordia Junior Messenger.

The treasurer shall collect all dues, shall receive all other money for the Society, shall keep an accuratc record of all receipts and disbursements, shall pay all bills approved, by the Society and shall render monthly reports and an annual report.

The chairman of Christian growth shall arrange a program of Christian knowledge, service, and training in accordance with the International program for this department. He shall especially foster Bible study leadership training, topic studies, mission study and all cultural activities in the Society. He shall supervise and diroct the missionary endeavors, recreation, publicity, and welfare activities in the Society.

The mombership committee shall endeavor to sain new members, shall call up members that aro negligent in attendance, and shall visit and report sick nembers.

With the appoval of the Executive Board, the chaiman of each department may appoint committees or staff officers to assist in any particular division of his department.
Article VIII -- Dissolution

This Society shall not be dissolved as long as five (5) members desire its continuance. In case of dissolution all property of the Society shall be given in charge of the Trustees of the Church.

> Article IX -- Resicnations

Any member wishing to resign shall submit to the membership committee a written resignation, which shall be acted upon in the next regular neeting.

> Article X - Changes or Amendment of the Constitution

This constitution may be anended or changed. by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Society at any regular business meeting, provided notice of tho proposed change or amendment has been given in the previous meeting.

## By-Laws

Article I -- Meetings
The regular meetings shall be held at the request of five (5) members, or at the call of the president.

Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail insofar as they do not conflict with the Constitution of this Society.

Article II -- Dues
Dues shall be paid on a proportionate basis, each member paying according to his ability and desire. Dues are payable at the first meeting of each month.

Article III
One-third ( $1 / 3$ ) of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
