

## LUTHERAN WOMEN'S MISSIONARY LEAGUE

Standing on the threshold of our hundredth anniversary, we look back and see a Ladies Society organized in 1882, then reorganized into a Ladies Aid Society <sup>in 1904</sup> with an active membership of 32. Throughout the years, under capable leadership and God's blessings, much was done to assist the congregation and charitable institutions. After affiliating with the District and National organization in 1943 the name was changed to the Lutheran Women's League. In January 1948 the evening division was organized and in September 1960, the Morning Division had its beginning. A combined membership of 68 makes this the largest and most active group with each being assigned a service responsibility within the church ~~with~~ to the needs of the altar, nursery, visitors and guest registry. In conjunction with the National league, "Mites" are collected each year, which averages several hundred dollars, ~~and~~ sent to the National treasury to be given as grants to new mission stations throughout the World.

While the groups bring members of the church together at its suppers and other social functions, the financial returns are not the chief aim as the ladies are happy to turn over their proceeds to the work of missions and charity, especially also to their own congregation. They encourage personal evangelism, work to integrate new members into the congregation and fosters Christian fellowship.
