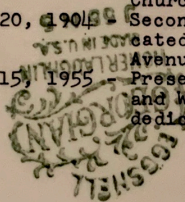



Important dates in the history of First Lutheran Church

Knoxville, Tennessee:

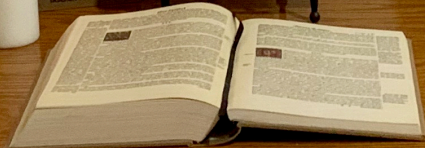
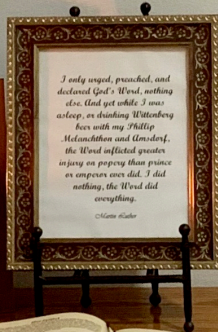
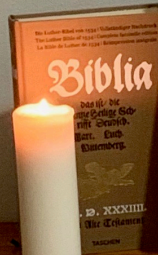
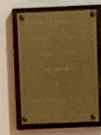
- October 12, 1869 - First Lutheran was organized.
- September 25, 1870 - First church was dedicated, Broadway and Western Avenue.
- September 6, 1892 - Parochial school was opened.
- October 14, 1897 - Affiliated with Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod.
- March 20, 1905 - Second church was dedicated, Broadway and Fifth Avenue.
- May 15, 1955 - Present church, Broadway and Wells Avenue, was dedicated.

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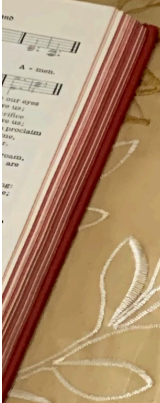
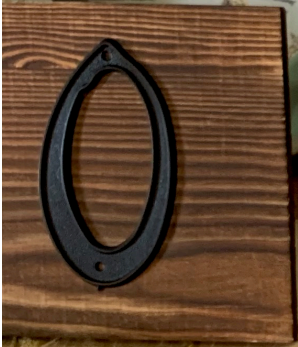
