From the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In 1520, Martin Luther wrote a letter to Pope Leo X. Luther was polite in tone while reminding the Pope that he held the power to reform the Church. A month before, Leo sent his Papal Bull excommunicating Luther. This was not the response he was expecting. We don't know if Leo ever got the letter or not.

But we know that with this letter was a copy of Luther's tract *The Freedom of the Christian*. In this tract, Luther argues two ideas: 1) A Christian is an utterly free man, lord of all, subject to none. 2) A Christian is an utterly dutiful man, servant to all.

Luther showed that he was following Jesus and St. Paul, not Aristotle. Aristotle argued that if there is a servant, then there is a master and vice versa. However, according to scripture, a Christian is both a master and servant in Christ. By faith alone, man is free in Christ. By faith alone, man serves his neighbor as a servant. In Christ, we live between these two poles of being slave and free at the same time. Love binds us together.

We see this distinction played out in Law and Gospel. Law shows that we need salvation. Christ alone is free to do anything, and yet He bound Himself under the Law to serve and save us with His death and resurrection. That is the source of our freedom in Christ — freedom to love and serve.

When you were baptized into Christ's death, you were set free from the penalty of the Law. This does not mean that you can do anything you want or have permission to go against the Law. Rather, having been set free from sin, we are set free to serve and love and be a servant of all. So it goes with Christ, so it goes with us.

The Freedom of the Christian is a confession, our confession. Freedom comes only from Christ Himself — His incarnation, cross, and empty tomb. Faith Alone by Grace Alone in Christ Alone revealed in Scripture Alone justifies us. Christ changes us. We are free in faith and free to serve in love.

Faith and love. That's what it's all about. That's what it's always been about.
