From the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today is the third part in our five-part series on our Mission Statement here at First Lutheran. "Strengthened by the Means of Grace we faithfully witness to Christ in the community and passionately share God's love through acts of mercy."

Each of our discussions has been on a different pillar that makes up the Mission Statement. For review, the pillars are Worship, Education, Witness, Fellowship, and Mercy. We have discussed both Worship and Education. Today our topic is Witness.

So often we have misguided ideas about Witness from other church bodies. For instance, the idea that it's up to you to save souls. Everyone you meet who isn't saved is on you. It's your job to make them want to accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior. But is that what Jesus promises His disciples in Matthew 28:16-20?

These verses are a baptism text, or at least it was understood to be a baptism text until a few hundred years ago. Now we refer to it as the Great Commission. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" has been made the center of the text. Are you doing your job of going out? If no, then why not?

What if I told you that our English translations normally fail to emphasize what Jesus is saying? Because what Jesus says is, "as you are going". As you are living your lives doing the things that you do, you will be baptizing and teaching. As you go about your daily tasks, you will be taught and strengthened for the days ahead.

This Matthew text was also historically used as a text supporting the Office of the Ministry in the "one holy Christian and apostolic Church." (Nicene Creed) It is within this Church that we are fed the Word, receive the Sacraments, are taught and strengthened for our different daily callings and tasks.

That's why this is the Third Pillar and not the First Pillar. We need to receive in the Divine Service before we can go out into the world. In Worship, the Word of God does the converting over time. We are then Taught, or catechized, in the Word. We hear it, ponder it, and are changed by it in our Educational offerings. We learn to trust that the Word will do what the Word always has done — make believers out of unbelievers.

That is why Evangelism is not knocking on doors and cold calling people. It's inviting to the waters and the Word. Evangelism is about bringing others into the sphere of our activities which are all centered on that Word given in the Means of Grace and taught for daily living in the world.

Stewardship

"There are three conversions necessary to every man: the head, the heart, and the purse." Attributed to Luther, this statement echoes what Jesus taught about hearts and treasures. He said, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." (Matthew 6:21; Luke 12:34)

But which conversion comes first? I submit that the order is this: first the head, then the purse, then the heart. Let's explore this topic.

Through the preaching of Law and Gospel, God grants us repentance, a changing of our minds. We are called to turn away from our sins and turn toward Him for forgiveness, life, and salvation. For when God calls us away from something, He is, at the same time, calling us to something.

And thus, He calls us to a new life, with new deeds. This is the conversion of the purse. Jesus said that "it is easier for a camel to enter through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God." (Matthew 19:24) Notice that our hearts follow our treasures, not the other way around. As Christians, God calls us to invest our treasures in His Kingdom to ensure that the gospel is preached and the sacraments are administered.

So where is your treasure? If it is not invested in the kingdom of God, then the only response is repentance – a conversion of the heart – and to begin doing just that.

This is not to say that you earn your way into heaven. It is simply to say that as Christians, those who have been made to be temples of the Holy Spirit, who have been given a new life in Christ, we are actually to live – think (conversion of the mind), do (conversion of the purse), and be (conversion

of the heart) – a new life in Him. And when you fail, know that God in Christ loves and forgives you and still calls you away from that and to Himself.
