

From the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The end of Lent is in view. Over the next two weeks, the Liturgy will be striped more and more away. The Gloria will be removed. Chanting will cease on Palm Sunday. The organ will get quieter and quieter, offering more of a supportive role. Maundy Thursday ends with the stripping of the altar while Psalm 22 is read. Good Friday has a bare altar in our worship and what candles are lit end up extinguished.

Then things begin to change. Easter Vigil starts in that darkness. The light slowly breaks in. The darkness scatters until there is a place left for it. Baptisms are remembered. Eucharist is celebrated. Resurrection is exclaimed. More celebrating on Easter Day and the days following.

Whether we know it or not, our worship during Holy Week and beyond, are examples of Goodness, Truth, and Beauty. These three: Goodness, Truth, and Beauty exist beyond space and time. They are transcendental. They relate to and seek to describe the nature of our

reality and being.

The three: Goodness, Truth, and Beauty are not subjective and for good reason. If Truth was subjective then we can't get angry when politicians lie to us. If Goodness is subjective then it's fine for people to abuse others for profit and greed. If Beauty is only in the eye of the beholder, then we have lost the right to be offended by obscene art.

The Good, the True, and the Beautiful are central to our concept of God. All three work together. Philosopher Peter Kreeft explained why when he said, "Goodness is first in value as truth and beauty have the end of good; beauty motivates us most; and, truth trumps both goodness and beauty."

Over these coming weeks, we are reminded that we are created to know God, receive His gifts, and worship Him. Because He made us, we want to know the Truth. We desire the Good for His salvation on that Friday. We love the Beautiful exemplified by a suffering Savior whose life surrounds us in stained glass on Sundays. Thus, Goodness, Truth, and Beauty are reflections of a perfect God who sent His Son to be born of Mary, commit no sin, suffer, die and rise again on Easter.

The Good, the True, and the Beautiful are found in Jesus Christ, His Word, His Creation, His redemption, His resurrection, and His doing it all for you.

Stewardship Blessed Shall You Be

"Blessed shall you be in the city, and blessed shall you be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of your womb and the fruit of your ground and the fruit of your cattle, the increase of your herds and the young of your flock. Blessed shall be your basket and your kneading bowl. Blessed shall you be when you go out."

(Deuteronomy 28:3-6)

This is God's promise to the Israelites as they stood beyond the Jordan outside of the Promised Land. He promises blessing to His people. He will make them prosper, whether they are in the city or the field. He will make their fruit of their work to prosper, whether from the ground, their wombs, their flocks, or their herds. He will make them to prosper in all things, whether upon their coming in or their going out.

But there's a catch. He would do this for Israel only "if you obey the voice of the LORD your God." (Deut. 28:2b) If they did that, He would cause that "all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you." (Deut. 28:2a). If they didn't obey the voice of the Lord, if they didn't keep the commandments of the Lord and "walk in his ways" (Deut. 28:9), they would be met with curse and woe. The blessings would be replaced with curses. Everything that the Lord promised to prosper and bless would be cursed and fail.

Thanks be to God that our Lord Jesus Christ has come into our flesh and fulfilled the law for us — in our place and for our benefit. Our Lord Jesus Christ died for us — in our place and for our benefit. Our Lord Jesus Christ is risen from the dead for us — in our place and for our benefit. By this we have justification before God. We are forgiven, clean, holy, and righteous.

The blessing of God is promised to us in Christ Jesus. It depends upon his work, not ours.

All this is ours in Holy Baptism. For in Holy Baptism, God claims us as His own, makes us His children, His heirs, and His holy people. And so it is that the work of our hands and its fruit is holy because we are holy in Christ. It is pressed into His service, and it thereby becomes a blessing to us and to our neighbor.

For this great gift, our reception of the blessings of God because of Christ Jesus our Lord, it is our duty to thank and praise, serve, and obey Him. This is not in order to receive the blessings but because in Christ we already have. With this in mind, we sit down on the first day of the week and set aside as He has prospered us to give to His church for His work of blessing in our midst (1 Cor. 16:2).
